Purpose:

To identify, report on and contribute insight to issues and concerns which impact the ability of our Renovator members to develop sustainable businesses.

Mandate:

The PKHBA Renovators' Council is focused on issues that affect the professional interests of our Renovator members including, but not limited to:

- Technical issues relevant to home renovation
- Inspection and permitting process
- Local implications of Provincial or National policy
- Combatting the underground economy
- Building codes and standards
- Professional development and standards
- Home modification and aging in place
- Housing affordability and supply

The Council provides information, advice and feedback to PKHBA Staff regarding operational issues within the broader context of Association policy.

The Council may also provide information, advice and feedback to the PKHBA Board regarding broader policy issues impacting the industry.

Equivalent Councils:

- CHBA Canadian Renovators' Council
 - o The Canadian Renovators' Council (CRC) addresses the professional interests of CHBA's renovator members, and the issues impacting their businesses. CRC is focused on continuing to add to the value of Association membership for professional renovators.
 - o The Council's work also includes monitoring government policies ranging from taxation and regulations to combatting the underground economy.
 - o CRC addresses technical issues relevant to home renovation in collaboration with CHBA's Technical Research Committee, such as building codes and standards; and on professional development and recognition for renovation professionals in collaboration with CHBA's Professional Development Committee.
- OHBA Renovators' Council
 - o The council works on professional standards, technical services, public awareness, government liaison and the long-term development of the renovation market.
